Weill Cornell Medical College (WCMC) seeks a highly motivated, customer service-orientated leader to join WCMC's EHS Safety Advisor program. EHS Safety Advisors work with a group of client departments to effectively implement environmental health and safety services and programs. Safety Advisors will independently evaluate chemical, biological, radiological, fire and general safety hazards as well as hazardous material shipments and waste management practices; implement effective safe work practices in accordance with established departmental standards and advance WCMC's safety culture. The EHS Safety Advisor training programs are developed by EHS Specialists and provides Safety Advisors extensive training on the technical and operational implementation of these programs. Upon completion of the EHS safety advisor training, incumbents are expected to independently implement EHS services and programs with routine supervisory review of safe work practice recommendations for high hazard operations.

Requirements: Bachelor's degree in science, engineering, environmental science, industrial hygiene, or closely related field. 1-2 years of work experience in a scientific, technical, or healthcare setting; or an equivalent combination of education and work experience. Must achieve (within 6 months of hire date) and maintain certification in WCMC EHS safety advisor training program. All training and certifications are provided internally by WCMC EHS.
